The Missing Ingredient in our Trials James 1:2

How do you survive the pressure of a trial? By the Missing ingredient = Joy. We are told to, "Count it all Joy."

"count" = think forward, consider, regard. "As you live in the present, consider the future, think forward to the future. Gloom now, but glory in the day to come."

PRINCIPLE: JOY IS THE FORCE THAT DRAWS YOU TO THINK BEYOND YOUR TRIAL.
