Introduction.			

Note three reasons why this book should be read, preached and teach through this small book:

- 1. First, this epistle <u>incorporates</u> both truth and love.
- 2. Secondly, this epistle <u>informs</u> us that truth and love, should always lead to obedience (4-9).
- 3. Thirdly, this epistle <u>includes</u> help in how respond to false teachers (Verses 10-11).

Note this exegesis of this letter in the following ways:

- I. FIRST, NOTICE THE <u>BASIS</u> OF CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP, WHICH BRINGS A WORD OF <u>COMMENDATION</u> (John 1-4).
- A. First, he commends the lady as a *person* (Verse 1a)
- B. Secondly, he commends her as a *participant* (Verses 1b-3).
 - 1. First, as a participant in the <u>truth</u> of the gospel (Verse 1b).
 - 2. Secondly, as a participant in the *thrust* of the gospel (2-3).

- C. Thirdly, he commends her as a *parent* (Verse 4).
- II. SECONDLY, NOTE THE <u>BEHAVIOR</u> OF THE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP, WHICH BRINGS A WORD OF <u>COMMAND</u> (Verses 5-6).
- A. First, notice how Christian love is <u>demanded</u> (Verse 3).
- B. Secondly, note how Christian love is <u>defined</u> (Verse 6).
- C. Thirdly, consider how Christian love is <u>distinctive</u> (Verse 7c) "... ye should walk in it."
 - 1. First, this distinctiveness is exposed in love *vertically* (Matthew 22:37-38).
 - 2. Secondly, this distinctiveness is expressed n love *horizontally*. (Matthew 22:39-40).

HOW?

- a. We need to <u>accept</u> the fact that love is not an *option* (John 13:35).
- b. We need to <u>acknowledge</u> the fact that love is not an <u>opinion</u> (2 John 6).
- III. THIRDLY, CONSIDER THE <u>BOUNDS</u> OF CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP, WHICH BRINGS A WORD OF <u>CAUTION</u> (John 7-11).

 - f. Sixthly, see these false teachers are <u>doomed</u> (9ab) "... hath not God."
- 2. Secondly, he shares how we should <u>regard</u> them (Verse 8).
 - a. First, keep yourselves so that you will not lose your *forward* progress in maturity (Verse 8a).
 - b. Secondly, keep yourselves that you will not lose a *full* reward (Verse 8b).
