I. FIRST, NOTE HOW GOD'S GENERAL WILL IS <u>IDENTIFIED</u> IN THE BIBLE.

The following five things are God's GENERAL will for every Christian:

- A. First, God's GENERAL will is that the Christian be *separated* (Romans 12:1-2).
- B. Secondly, God's GENERAL will is that every Christian be a *soul winner* (2 Peter 3:9).
- C. Thirdly, God's GENERAL will is that every Christian be *satisfied* (1 Thessalonians 5:18).
- D. Fourthly, God's GENERAL will is that every Christian be a *servant* (2 Corinthians 8:5).
- E. Fifthly, God's GENERAL will is that every Christian be *sanctified* (1 Thessalonians 4:5).

II. SECONDLY, NOTICE HOW GOD'S WILL IS INFLUENCED IN THREE AREAS.

The Christian is to get God's influence and direction through:

- A. First, through the Word of God—the *Bible* (Psalm 119:105).
- B. Secondly, through the Spirit of God—the *Holy Spirit* (John 16:13).

C. Thirdly, through the men of God—the *pastors* and teachers (Ephesians 4:11-14).
