WHAT WE BELIEVE AND HOW WE BEHAVE—10 "How God Justifies The Ungodly"

Romans 4:1-25

Introduction:

I. FIRST, NOTICE HOW HE <u>DEMONSTRATES</u> THAT THE "FAITH PLUS" VIEW IS WRONG (Romans 4:1-12).

- A. First, note how he deals with people who depend on FAITH PLUS ______ for their salvation (4:1-8).
 - 1. First, he uses Israel's *Patriarch* as an example (4:1-5)
 - a. First, notice his *appeal* relating to Abraham's situation (4:1-2).
 - b. Secondly, note his *application* relative to Abraham's salvation (4:3-5).
 - Secondly, he uses Israel's <u>Monarch</u> as an example (4:6-8).
 - a. First, salvation is freely *bestowed* (4:6).
 - b. Secondly, confessed sin is forever *banished* (4:7-8).
- B. Secondly, notice how he deals with those who declare that FAITH PLUS their *worship* or religion is necessary for their salvation (4:9-12).
 - 1. First, notice the *plan* for receiving righteousness (4:9).
 - a. First, look at the *complication* (4:9).
 - b. Secondly, note the *explanation* (4:9b).
 - 2. Secondly, note the *pattern* for receiving righteousness (4:10)

This was a big question to the Jewish believers:

- a. First, note their *explanation* (4:10a).
- b. Secondly notice Paul's *explanation* (4:10b).
 - 3. Thirdly, consider the *proof* of receiving righteousness (4:11-12).

*First, he demonstrates circumcision as a *sign*. *Secondly, he describes circumcision as a *seal*.

Now look at the proofs of Bible salvation:

- a. First, it is proven by what we <u>believe</u> (4:11).
- b. Secondly, it is proven by how we <u>behave</u> (4:12)
 - (1) First, he believed in God's Word without ever experiencing the fullness of its *promises*.
 - (2) Secondly, he believed in Jesus Christ without ever seeing Him in *Person*.
